A Note From Bryan. . . Against the Odds

Romans 15:4 tells Christians today how to understand the Old Testament, "For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope." The Old Testament is not the covenant that we live under, yet, it has much to teach us, and as a whole, it really tells the story of how God redeemed Israel. It is a testament to us of the lengths God is willing to go to in order to redeem His people and was revealed to us to give us that comfort and reassurance. The Old Testament helps us understand the New Testament in light of the truth that God wants to redeem us against all odds.

Right now you may be facing some very challenging odds in your life. Unemployment, underemployment, foreclosure, diminished savings, and many other economic odds are challenging many in this audience today. God's word reassures us at times like these that God is willing and able to redeem us from such odds and others. Understand that God never promised that we would be shielded from the unfortunate circumstances of this life. Yet, if we learn anything from the Bible, it is that God uses trials and tribulations to mold and shape us into His image.

The Exodus of Israel from Egyptian bondage is a fitting example of God's power to deliver against all odds. The text of Exodus 1:1-2:10 reveals to us that every challenge the Pharaoh could throw at the Israelite, although causing them great pain, caused their growth. Everything Pharaoh did to oppress the Israelites God overcame with His great mercy and power. We are going to look at this account in greater depth in order to offer you the strength and encouragement you need against the great odds we face today. Just remember that even when a child of God is down, he or she does not have to be out.
