A Note From Bryan... This Little Light of Mine...

Children like to sing this song. There is a little bit of action that goes into the song that helps children remember the song. Do they really understand the words? Probably not but that's ok because they are learning and if they practice the song long enough they'll never forget it. As a matter of fact you are probably singing it under your breath right now. As adults we remember the song well; letting our light shine all around the neighborhood, won't hide it under a bushel basket, and won't let Satan "whoosh" it out.

The idea of the song obviously comes from the Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 5:13-16, "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." We know that we are the light bearers for Jesus but we may not know exactly how to make that light shine so brightly.

The Sermon on the Mount seems so long and covers so much sometimes we get lost in its profoundness and fail to realize that the passage above seems to be introducing the content on how to let your light shine before men. How exactly do we exert the influences of salt and light on the world at large? Today's lesson will suggest a few ideas from Jesus' sermon giving us some ideas of "how to" apply His lesson to our lives.
