### A Note From Bryan... The Jesus Controversary

You cannot be neutral when it comes to Jesus. You cannot sit on the fence on this one. We have occasions in our lives where we are pressed for an answer or challenged in our beliefs. These occasions can be very costly and they can come and go very quickly where you have to give an answer or remain silent. The gospels show us that Jesus created a controversy between the religious and secular worlds and all their hatred came down to a night where He was put on trial, unlawfully, and in the end was executed because of the controversy. The religious people tried to convict Him of blasphemy and false doctrine. The secular world tried to convict Him of an illegal kingdom. All the while, He and His disciples were in the middle. The disciples struggled with their faith, Jesus endured interrogation and torture.

The controversy still exists. Just like in the pages of the four Gospels Jesus still challenges the status quo. Jesus still challenges the religious and the secular to make a decision. Just like so many years ago Jesus will still rock the core of the foundations your life is built upon. Jesus demands a decision from you about what you believe about Him and how deeply you hold those convictions. The world around you will try to convict you on what you believe. They will convict you of harsh judgment if they don't like what you believe. They will try to contradict what you say and find fault in your words. Still you have to decide. That is what our lesson is about this morning; making a decision about Jesus. What will you decide?
