### A Note From Bryan... The First Lord's Supper

A good habit is hard to make and easy to break. A bad habit is easy to make and hard to break. This little saying comes from an unknown source and it is very accurate. If attending worship service for you is just a habit it is still a good habit; keep it up. Habits are also things we often do without thought. There are many things we do without thought that just sort of become second nature to us. It is said that a person never forgets how to ride a bicycle. Often habitual, second nature tasks are referred to as being "like riding a bicycle" in other words you never forget how to do it.

Worship becomes something of a habit in the sense that we often participate in it without thinking of the meaning and significance of what we are doing or where it came from. Often, young people who become Christians have so many questions as to why we do certain things in worship. People who visit the church of Christ for the first time question many things they witness in worship. People who have formed the habit of church going may find these questions puzzling because praying, singing, giving, reading, teaching, and preaching from the Bible, and taking the Lord's Supper have become an unquestioned habit.

In today's lesson we are going to look at several passages of Scripture that answer some of these questions that regard the taking of the Lord's Supper. Matthew 26:26-29 and 1 Corinthians 11:23-34 both answer several questions people have about the Lord's Supper. Where did the Lord's Supper come from? Who should take the Lord's Supper and how often? When should a person take the Lord's Supper? How should a person take the Lord's Supper?

The passages we are going to look at today answer these questions for us. It is also good for mature Christians to be reminded of these answers so that the Lord's Supper doesn't just become some unquestioned routine. In many "Christian" religions the Lord's Supper has lost its place in the worship and is only taken occasionally. The justification given for this practice is to take the routine out of it and make it more special. However, the Scriptures indicate that the Lord's Supper is really the central act of worship, not just a mere optional accessory that can be tweaked to fit our moods and personal tastes.
