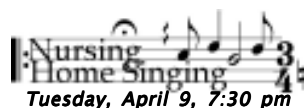

Mission to Pakistan Update

The opportunity is still great to teach the women of Pakistan who are seeking hope in their oppressed lives. This is all made possible through God's blessings and your generous support, commitment and prayers.

The theme for 2013 mission to Pakistan is The Glory of God. Since the mission began, 637 women have obeyed the gospel of Christ and we have established 33 Sewing and Bible Centers throughout Pakistan, serving women year round.

Over 10,000 Bibles have been placed in the hands of women in this country, a place where Bibles are prohibited, and the Birthing Clinic serves women in Sahiwal and surrounding villages.

This year we are expanding the teaching materials, Bible stories and flip charts for the children's Bible school classes. Such materials are non-existent in Pakistan.

FORGIVING SOMEONE WHO HASN'T DONE ANYTHING WRONG

I forgive you for – not inviting me to your party, for beating me in a game of basketball, for failing to shake my hand in the church foyer, for kindly disagreeing with me, for living your life differently than I would, for not marching to the beat of my drum, for having more stuff than I have, for refusing to tell me where you caught that big fish!

Ah, but you don't need my forgiveness! I need to get over it. I need to grow up and stop acting like a child.

We have devalued forgiveness! Jesus prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23.34). Who needed forgiveness? The mob that murdered him! Jesus didn't forgive people because they hired a different carpenter. He forgave sins. If someone has sinned against me, they need my forgiveness. When sin is committed the Bible tells the sinner what to do in order to be forgiven and the one sinned against how to respond. What passage relates to me treating someone like a sinner when they haven't done anything wrong?

Perhaps I Corinthians 13.4 applies, "Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up." Perhaps I Corinthians 13.5 applies, "does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil." What about "bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things" (I Corinthians 13.7)? Perhaps vs. 11 of the same chapter helps the most; "When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things."

I take back what I said earlier. I don't forgive you. You haven't sinned against me or against God. I'm going to love you and get over it. Matter of fact, will you forgive me for the way I've been treating you?
