### A Note From Bryan... Deception

How does it make you feel to find out that you have been deceived? The answer is almost obvious and so automatic no one should have to ask. No one likes to be deceived. Deception is painful and embarrassing and to find out one has been deceived often initially causes great anger. One of the reasons deception is so destructive is that it is often too late when it is discovered.

We go to great lengths to protect ourselves from deception. We protect our personal information from potential scammers. When we require the services of a contractor we seek out referrals and testimonies to make sure we are being served by reputable vendors. Deception is most painful when it comes from a close relation or a once trusted friend. Deception destroys that trust and often leaves a relationship irreparably damaged.

This morning I want to share with you a number of passages in our Bibles that warn us of the dangers of many deceptions. Several different times and on different occasions Christians are warned, "do not be deceived..." Yet in our nation every day millions are deceived by empty promises and formulas for spiritual regeneration and healing. Like the false prophets of old many self-styled spiritualists today are working overtime to seduce Christians and non-Christians alike into a false notion that there is no sin and that the Bible is not the only objective truth from God.

The importance of these Scriptural warnings cannot be denied nor can the timely nature of such warnings. Our young people's souls are at stake because they are at risk of buying into such feel-good nonsense. It may surprise and shock you where these ideas are coming from today. To be forewarned is to be forearmed against such challenges to our faith. I hope you will find wisdom and benefit from what I have to share with you today.
