A Note From the Elders . . . The World Has Changed

Many changes have occurred in the past 100 years. In 1904 the average life expectancy in the U.S. was 47 years. Just 14 percent of the homes in the U.S. had a bathtub; only 8 percent of the homes had a telephone. A three-minute call from Denver to New York City cost \$11.00.

There were some 8,000 cars in the U.S. with about 144 miles of paved roads. The maximum speed limit in most cities was 10 mph. Alabama, Mississippi, Iowa and Tennessee were each more heavily populated than California.

More than 95 percent of all births in the U.S. took place at home. Coffee was fifteen cents a pound. Most women only washed their hair once a month and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.

The leading causes of death one hundred years ago were: 1) pneumonia and influenza, 2) TB, 3) diarrhea, 4) heart disease, and 5) stroke. There were about 230 reported murders in the entire U.S.

The changes that have taken place are mindboggling. Yet, with all that has changed in the world about us, one thing has remained constant- God's Word. Even though men continue to try to "update" or modernize His Word, the Bible has not and will not change. Peter's message on the Day of Pentecost is still: ***"Repent and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit"*** (Acts 2:38). Many seek to change worship to make it more "entertaining"; some refuse to accept Paul's inspired command for women to be in subjection in the worship (1 Timothy 2:11-14). Even in the brotherhood, some are perverting the gospel by saying one can be saved by just accepting Jesus into his/her heart.

The changes that will occur in our world in the next 100 years are beyond our ability to comprehend. But we can rest assured God's Word will still be the same as it was in the first century - and the same as it is today.

Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away.
