A Note From the Elders . . . 35th Anniversary

On March 28, 1976, six families met at the home of J.L. and Louise Tomlin to discuss the possibility of beginning the Lord's church at Woodstock. Those present were the Herndons, Johnsons, Evans, Weavers, Goodwins and Tomlins. Their prayers, plans and efforts brought the first meeting in on May 2, 1976. The church met in a rented building on Mill Street. Thirty-five to fifty were expected at the first meeting, but an overwhelming number of 79 souls gathered together for that first worship service. It was not long until the attendance reached 100. The first item of business for the newly formed congregation was plans for a new building. The first couple of years showed vigorous growth and by 1978, the average attendance for Sunday morning had reached about 160. In May 1977, a building site of 4.11 acres was purchased on Rope Mill Road where the present building stands. In the fall of 1978, the congregation began worshipping in the basement of their new building. The building was completed and "open house" was observed on May 6, 1979. Almost immediately it became obvious that more room was needed as the years 1979 through 1981 saw an almost unbelievable growth rate of 31% per year. Once again the congregation rose to the task at hand. They made plans and went to work to provide an adequate facility for the rapidly growing congregation. In 1982, the building was remodeled, providing a 600 seat auditorium, about 20 classrooms and a large fellowship hall. In 1987, the house and 3.7 acres to the south of the building were purchased. The 1600 square foot house housed the offices and a youth activities center until converted to a minister's residence. In May 2001, a groundbreaking was held to begin the facelift, which, when completed in August 2004, brought the building to its current state, adding new nurseries, a library, two new classrooms and a worship center for our Spanish congregation. And on this day - May 1, 2011 - we celebrate our 35th anniversary as a congregation, holding fast to God's Word and appreciating all those who have given so much to make this day possible. May God continue to bless His church family throughout the coming years here at Woodstock.
