A Note From Bryan...

Settling Issues

We've already settled the issue of instrumental music in worship and the necessity of baptism...or so we thought. Generations later people still challenge these issues and scores of other issues. Wouldn't it be great if we could just all agree on the fundamentals of doctrine and settle the issues once and for all? That's the thing about "settling" issues: they are not settled for everyone for all time. There are many reasons why things "get settled" and then come up again and again.

In Galatians 2 Paul wrote to the Galatian church over an issue that had long been settled. Doctrinal issues are nothing new. First century Christians were susceptible to the "issues" of their own day. In the churches of Galatia certain individuals had stolen into some of these congregations to enslave them in law keeping turning them away from grace and liberty in Christ. This heresy was referred to as the Judaizing heresy, the philosophical view point was that you had to first be a Jew and keep the Law of Moses to be a Christian.

This heresy was causing so many problems in these young churches. The problem however, existed before and had supposedly been addressed at the Jerusalem council we read about in Acts 15. Somewhere, somehow, someone did not agree and raised the issue again by spreading heresy among young, vulnerable Christians.

This is something that we will notice in greater detail in the lesson. Galatians 1 and 2 are related in at least three ways that will be pointed out. 1.) That the one true gospel is for men of all walks of life. Paul was concerned primarily with proving that it wasn't just for Jews but that it was also for the Gentiles (all other nations). We should look at it from the standpoint of it being for the big and the small; the important and not so important. 2.) That the one true gospel still creates controversy in the world and even among brethren. The apostle Peter and Barnabas were even caught up in the hypocrisy! 3.) That the one true gospel makes all men free in Christ. Paul confronted Peter publicly with his hypocrisy attempting to divide the brotherhood into racial factions, to show favoritism and enslave people with a yoke of bondage. This really is an intriguing chapter and I hope that you will benefit from this study.
