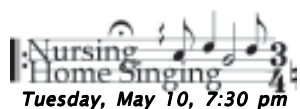

A Note From the Elders . . . Rush to Condemn or Forgive?

Have you ever heard the question "If Christians are supposed to be so forgiving, then why are they so quick to condemn"?

Let that one sink in.

As followers of Jesus, we should be the most forgiving bunch of folks out there. Jesus forgave the woman who was caught in the act of sleeping with someone other than her husband (John 8). Jesus forgave the woman "who lived a sinful life" when she poured perfume on His feet (Luke 7). Even though Zacchaeus was widely thought of as a sinner, Jesus went and ate at Zacchaeus' house (Luke 19). He even said, "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven" (Matt 5). If someone is our enemy we should pray for them; how forgiving is that?

If that is how Jesus treated the evil and the broken people around Him, why are we so quick to condemn? The question stings a little.

Your opinion about this question is as good as mine, but my guess is that we don't put in the time and effort to get to know sinful people. If I hear that brother so-and-so has a problem with stealing things, it is a lot easier for me to denounce and condemn him than it is for me to get to know him. But if I ever did get to know him, I might find out he stopped stealing things when he came to Christ and now he is a pretty good guy. Or I might find out he hates his kleptomania and wants help getting past it. I might find it a lot harder to condemn him if I knew him.

We need to change the current prevailing view that Christians are judgmental. We need to switch, "Why are they so quick to condemn?" to "Why are they so quick to forgive?" True, we can't condone evil. We do need to take a stand against sin. But we need to take a stand like Jesus did, saying, "Then neither do I condemn you. Go now and leave your life of sin" (John 8).
