A Note From Bryan... Into All the World

There are two basic reasons why missions at home and abroad are so critical. The first reason is that people are lost and in need of Jesus. It is wholly unpopular to suggest that people are lost. This is true of the sentiments of religious people as well as secular society. Unfortunately the "we shouldn't judge" crowd has had an incredible influence on church people making them believe it is wrong to suggest that anyone is in need of salvation. The Bible says that the vast majority of the world is in need of salvation, Matthew 7:13, 14. This idea is presented in many other passages as well. If you believe that offering salvation to people is an unjust judgment of their spiritual condition then you will see no need for missions and will therefore not be involved. You might even think it wrong to be involved in soul-seeking efforts of any kind.

The second reason why mission efforts are so important is because we have been commanded by God to "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." To get grammatically technical, the command is to preach the gospel. Going into all the world follows this main verb in force. It is assumed that we will be going whether that means crossing an ocean or several political boundaries and that wherever we might find ourselves going to preach the gospel in those places. Either way God expects us to tell the story of Jesus so that men will choose to change their lives. What we are up against is a world that is unaware of its need to obey the gospel as well as those who are hostile to the idea of salvation. On top of this many Christians feel intimidated by the prospect of sharing the message. Today we are going to look at Mark's account of the Great Commission to prepare our minds for understanding the urgency of mission work.
