### *From the Elders--The Greatest Gift a Friend Can Give Another*

When Acts 2 speaks about the early church, we see Christians who were continually together: in the temple, eating together, praising God and having favor with all the people. Personal goods were sold and the money was distributed to every person as he had need. The words "mine" and "yours" seemed to be foreign to this body of believers. It was a church on fire, a true light set on a hill that had the neighbors talking while seeking to find out more about those who were members of the Way.

James also saw the importance of love and faith in action. He taught us that love equals action, confronting sin head on: "Brethren, if anyone among you wanders from the truth, and someone turns him back, let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save a soul from death and cover a multitude of sins." (James 5:19-20).

What does this mean for us today? Don't you think that James really understood that human beings will do almost anything to avoid confronting an issue? That we tend to never get too close to each other lest we learn "too much" about each other...that we talk about everything else except salvation...but that deep down inside we wish that we had the drive to go out and save the world?

Don't give up...don't quit trying. Your words and deeds of kindness and the trust that your friends show in you: these all lead to that moment in time when you have the opportunity to guide a soul back on the way to Christ. And this is the greatest gift that one friend can give another.
