A Note From Bryan... A Flavoring of Heresy

Pagan religion was, and is, spectacular. Whether you consider Native American ceremonial dancing or fertility rituals of the Philistines, false religion provides a seductive display that draws spectators into participation.

Denominational groups incorporate a variety of elements designed to entertain or impress. They are often spectacular, but they are not Christian.

The Straight and Narrow. God has always called His people to purity. The Lord never wants ungodly elements mixed into the religion He has provided for His people. When the Israelites entered the Promised Land, for example, God warned them not to embrace Philistine worship: *'[T]ake care that you be not ensnared to follow them, after they have been destroyed before you, and that you do not inquire about their gods, saying, 'How did these nations serve their gods?--that I also may do the same.' You shall not worship the Lord your God in that way, for every abominable thing that the Lord hates they have done for their gods, for they even burn their sons an dtheir daughters in the fire to their gods. Everything that I command you, you shall be careful to do. You shall not add to it or take from it" (Deuteronomy 12:30-32ESV).*

God commanded the Israelites, "Do not inquire about their gods saying, 'How did these nations serve their gods?--that I also may do the same.'" God was not merely prohibiting a false religion; God was prohibiting incorporating pagan practices into the worship of the true God.

Follow the Pattern. God's people were not to mix true and false religion for two reasons. First, the pagan religions were in themselves an affront to God. They practices abominable worship. Second, God's pattern, as give in His commandments, was to be followed. God's people must not add to or take from the Word of God.

Christians, like the Israelites of old, are surrounded by the spectacle of false religion. Many today are being seduced into borrowing practices from a wide range of denominational groups. From observing Lent and embracing monastic practices dawn from Catholicism to using entertainment and emotional elements of the charismatics, the purity of New Testament worship is debased.

The apostle Paul commands, *"If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed" (Galatians 1:9).* What Paul said was accursed, many today will embrace. Christians must be careful that the pure truth of God's church is not compromised with elements drawn from ungodly sources.

Visitors' Luncheon

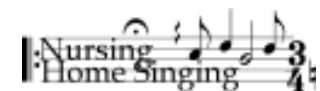
We welcome all visitors to our services today.
