Welcome to the Lord's church that meets at Woodstock, Georgia. We find our authority in the inspired word of God and are governed in organization, faith, worship and work according to God's Holy Word.

The Church – Christ's Special Community

No human community goes to such lengths to avoid offending a member. We find it striking that Paul can agree in principle with one group and request that their behavior conform to the weaknesses of the other.

Why does Paul place himself in the difficult position of proclaiming freedom while calling on his people to exercise limits on freedom? The answer must come from Paul's understanding of the cross.

His sacrifice was a totally selfless act. Christ died for us. Every brother – even the uninformed brother – is one "for whom Christ died" (1 Cor. 8:11).

Christ died to form His special community. His selfless death is the model for our behavior. If He died for all of us, then our conduct should demonstrate that we live for each other. To live for ourselves at the expense of another is to sin against the cross of Christ.

The cross summons us to give up on the selfish life of unrestrained freedom. It reminds us that Jesus died to bring the community into existence. We too must die daily for the church. There is no Christianity without a community that reflects the meaning of the cross.

Because Christ died for everyone, he has given us a new attitude toward our brother who does not share our biases. He has demonstrated His love for both weak and strong by dying to create a fellowship for all.

Can different cultures come together in fellowship? The answer from Romans is not only that we can, but that we are compelled to. The Christ who died for all has created the fellowship. It is maintained when we accept those whom Christ has already accepted.
