A Note From Bryan... Off in the Ditch

In Deuteronomy 5:32 Moses shared a warning from God with the generation that would inhabit the Promised Land. He said, "Therefore you shall be careful to do as the Lord your God has commanded you; you shall not turn aside to the right hand or to the left." By the time Jesus came to minister and fulfill the Law of Moses, God's people were off in a spiritual ditch.

One of the best descriptions I have ever heard of the Pharisees was that they were the protectors of the orthodoxy. They were viciously loyal to a set of traditions that were often contrary to the law. More importantly their tradition had become more important to them than the Law. The Pharisees and scribes stand as a great example of what not to do in ministry.

Luke 5:17, 21, and 30 give us a glimpse of what the Pharisees ministry had become. Verse 17 says that the Pharisees and teachers of the law were just sitting around. No doubt they had heard of the amazing things Jesus was doing and wanted to check Him out so they were idling around. In verse 21, the NKJV says they were "reasoning" about Jesus' authority to forgive sins and accusing Him of blasphemy. The word there can be translated as questioning or debating as well. By the time one gets to verse 30 the Pharisees and scribes were complaining against the disciples. A ministry marked by idleness, critical questioning, and grumbling is one that has gotten off in a spiritual ditch.

Jesus ministry, by contrast, was one that was vibrant with preaching, prayer, healing, and converting. In ministering to the saints and the lost, let us keep in mind that our ministry must be one that is restorative: where preaching fills people with hope, a ministry bathed in prayer, and a ministry where lives are permanently changed for the better.
