A Note From Bryan. . . Proclaiming Liberty

July 4, 1776 was the day that our fledgling nation, only a collection of far-flung colonies, adopted the Declaration of Independence thereby declaring our independence from the United Kingdom of Great Britain. Two hundred and Thirty-four years later we still celebrate and mark this national, federal holiday. Most modern celebrations involve family, food, and fireworks. In 234 years we have largely developed a very individualistic society as was intended by the founding fathers. We like our independence; we treasure our freedoms and seek to safeguard them.

Independence is a work that sounds good to our ears and is something that we strive for in many aspects of our lives. We all have at least a vague notion that we can achieve some manner of financial independence. We work and learn a skill, trade, or profession that can afford us a certain amount of independence. We scrimp and save so that we can live beyond our working years with a measure of independence. We seek mental and emotional independence in our earthly lives. God said that it was not good for a man to be alone and that a man should leave his father and mother and cleave to his wife. We become independent of our parents and become one with our husbands and wives in an independent and interdependent relationship and then we start the cycle over again by teaching our children to become emotionally stable and independent adults.

God created man to be so absolutely free. Mankind seeks to enslave. God's way has always been liberty. By a powerful hand God defeated the Egyptian Pharaoh and led His people to freedom. They, themselves, always tended to enslave themselves whether to sin or to other nations. Jesus proclaimed to the people of His hometown, Luke 4:18-19, that the Spirit of the Lord had anointed Him to proclaim liberty to the captives and to set at liberty the oppressed.

God has left us a legacy of freedom. If you are a citizen of the United States you are free but with limited freedoms and those freedoms are being eroded year after year by those who seek to enslave you. In John 8:31-36 Jesus spoke about an independence that could never be taken from you by anyone else. Jesus was talking about a kind of freedom that could be had even by those who were hopelessly enslaved: He was the hope of liberation. You may be a free citizen but are you free indeed? No matter what freedom you enjoy it is important to remember that you will never be independent of God.
