A Note From Bryan... Salvation

Earlier this year 3 or 4 professional athletes took off on a fishing trip and only one of them returned safely as I recall. Their boat sank and only one was found alive. A popular television docu-drama, *Deadliest Catch* follows Alaskan crab fishing crews documenting the dangers that are faced by these fishermen in the icy, treacherous waters between Alaska and Russia. Every season men are washed overboard and some perish in the cold ocean.

I cannot image what it would be like to be floating in a vast ocean of any kind. I certainly cannot imagine the shock and horror of being swept overboard or being aboard a sinking vessel in a polar sea. A couple of my friends know what it's like because they survived being lost in the Gulf of Mexico when their boat sank during a diving trip off the coast of Sarasota, Florida. They tied themselves together in their wetsuits and drifted for several days and were rescued many miles from where the boat sank.

The feeling of being lost in an unforgiving ocean could be crippling. A person might give up hope of ever being rescued. On the other hand, the feeling of being rescued must be an unexplained euphoria; to be plucked from certain death. This could give you a new perspective on life and its value.

Today many millions of souls are lost in a sea of confusion drifting aimlessly and in danger of slipping beneath the waves to a horrible end. There is hope and that hope is only found in Jesus Christ. Being saved from the darkness and depths of sin gives people a new perspective on life and how it should be lived. Today we are going to discuss salvation. I am going to share with you what the Bible says it takes to be saved and then what it means to be saved. I hope you will listen to the simple precepts found in Scripture and that you will find the rescue for which you've been looking.
