A Note From Bryan... Inspiring and Influencing Christian Values

Inspiring and Influencing Christian values is something we do through modeling and teaching. Our behavior is something that must match our words. Our behavior must reflect our values. The New Testament teaches us that when we act inconsistent with the Scriptures we open the door to blasphemy (Romans 2:24; 1 Timothy 6:1; Titus 2:5; 1 Peter 4:14; 2 Peter 2:2). When we use foul language, tell dirty jokes, lie, steal, or any number of common behaviors we let others know that our faith is not very important and people around us begin to think that the Christian life is ineffectual.

The enemies of the cross are looking for opportunities to prove that you are not what you claim to be. The enemies of the cross look for every opportunity to prove God is a myth and that Jesus can't save you. The enemies of the cross search vainly to disprove the Bible as the word of God. Christians must do a better job of teaching and modeling biblical values.

Luke 6:11 says that Jesus' enemies, who preferred darkness over the light He brought into this world (John 8:12), were "filled with rage and discussed with one another what they might do to Jesus." While all this was going on in the background, verses 12-49 tells how Jesus kept right on doing good works, inspiring and influencing the values of the people. There were three essential things we can notice Him doing that we can repeat today to inspire and influence the values of men today.

The first was that Jesus chose 12 men to be specially trained messengers for God. We must continue to find those with a passion for the word and send them out to preach. Second, Jesus had a message that transformed the minds of men. People gathered from miles around to hear Jesus and to be healed by Him. We come together today to hear the message and be changed by it. Finally we see that Jesus taught things that were contrary to "conventional wisdom"; things that challenged the status quo and sought to create a new, hopeful perspective in those who needed it most.
