A Note From Bryan... Two Important Questions From Jesus

You remember Matthew 16:13-20 because that is where Peter confessed Jesus as the Christ. But did you know that Peter was prompted by two very important questions from Jesus? Jesus had again gotten away from the attention of His Jewish detractors. He was with His disciples around a place called Caesarea-Philippi. As they were traveling, Jesus first asked, "Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am?" The disciples were ready with an answer.

It seems as though the talk on the street was really divided and confused about Jesus' identity. Most people, due to their experience, were thinking that Jesus was a resurrected prophet, like John, Elijah, or Jeremiah. Others thought Jesus was just simply like one of the prophets of old. In their limited experience, what else could they have conceived?

The second question was more to the point and what people were saying about Jesus wasn't as important as what His own disciples believed about Him. More to the point Jesus asked, "But who do **you** say that I am?" Peter spoke up with a ready answer. To him, Jesus was indeed the Christ, the Son of the living God. Ask people today the same question and what will they say? Some say Jesus was just a nice guy who helped a lot of people. Others might say He was an ancient religious leader on the order of Gandhi or Mother Theresa. There are those who admit that Jesus was a prophet, but will not confess Him as the Son of the Living God. Unfortunately, there are those today who would say that Jesus is a myth. The most important question, like the text infers, who do you think Jesus was and is today?

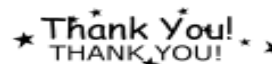
"House to House, Heart to Heart" in Spanish
