A Note From Bryan. . .

Deliberate Faith

To be deliberate about something you have to do it intentionally and mean it. To be deliberate about something you must be certain about it and convicted that it is the right thing to do. To be deliberate about your faith you must practice your faith with certainty and conviction. This is made difficult because of the influence the world has on us. We don't like to stand out in a way that might be considered weird. We would rather blend in with our surroundings.

I don't want you to misunderstand that last statement in the paragraph above. In 1 Peter 2:9, God's people are called a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation. The KJV mentions "a peculiar people." We take that to mean weird when the Greek text actually lends itself to "a people to possess" or own. It is true that we must be different from the world while living in it. The New Testament also indicates that we ought to set out to live a quiet and peaceable life (1 Thessalonians 4:11; 1 Timothy 2:2).

The world we live in seems to be growing in its hostility toward Christianity and its exclusive claims to Jesus as the only way. Our world suspects anyone who lives with certainty of Christian conviction. Our world argues for tolerance and moral equivocation. This morning I want to present you with biblical evidence of the importance of living your Christian life deliberately. James 1:19-27 tells us to "be." He informed Christians so long ago in an uncertain world when to "be" quick and when to "be" slow. He also told them to "be" doers of the word and not hearers only. So today we are going to look into the perfect law of liberty (James 1:25) in order to discover how to live with a deliberate faith.
