A Note From Bryan... Exemplary Service

Exemplary Service...is rewarded! When you sit down in a restaurant you expect to receive a gracious welcome and someone who will gladly wait on you because that is why we eat out, right? You may not expect to get great service even though that is essentially what you are paying for other than the meal itself; you are paying for someone to wait on you and clean up after you. Lousy service is frustrating especially when you are paying for it!

Like it or not we are called to be servants. How would God rate your service to Him? After all He did pay for it with His own blood! Jesus said that He came to this earth to serve rather than be served and to give His life as a ransom for many, Matthew 20:28. Jesus left us one of the greatest examples of how we are to serve our brothers and sisters as well as our fellow man.

John 13:1-20 will serve as our text this morning. This is the passage where we read of Jesus washing the disciple's feet in a demonstration of how none of us is really above one another and certainly not above Christ. It was also a demonstration of how even the most menial of tasks should not be beneath the dignity of any of us. While we find several women in the Scriptures washed Jesus' feet, nowhere in the scriptures do we find an example of foot washing as an act of worship. The stress is on humility and willing, exemplary service.

This is a passage that should cause us to examine our lives and what we are willing to do in service. Have we been conditioned to believe that we are only supposed to serve in a capacity that uses our unique abilities? Do we really not know how to serve or have we just not found a "service" we can be comfortable with? Are we just waiting for the right program to come along and stir us? Are we just waiting for an invitation? Are we simply busying and excusing ourselves from being the servants we know we can and should be?

I can't say for sure that today's lesson will answer these questions conclusively. I cannot answer any of these questions for you. Only you have the answers and my hope is that these and other questions about service will stir you to at least talk to God about where you are today and ask Him to help you with the strength and wisdom needed to be pleasing to Him as you live your life.
