A Note From Bryan... Do This and Live

"Do this and live..." seems like a simple prescription. Like anything else that is easy to do it's just as easy not to do. In Luke 10:25-28 Jesus was tested by a certain lawyer who asked Jesus what to do to inherit eternal life. Wouldn't it be great if that was the first question on the minds of the lost? What to do to inherit eternal life is one of the easier questions to answer. It is a great pleasure to share the gospel with someone who sincerely wants to know as did the crowd on the Day of Pentecost, Acts 2:37.

Jesus' response to this question was interesting. He answered the question with two other questions of His own, "What is written and what is your reading of it?" Jesus appealed to the written word which finds easy application to us today. What is written is a saving message that is understandable to the common man. Jesus also appealed to this man's understanding of what he read. Today we must be careful not to place meaning into the text through our own subjective experience. God's word, what is written, is objective, absolute, and inerrant. Jesus' questions help us to realize that what is written and our reading of it matters!

When the man quoted the greatest command Jesus responded with powerful words, "Do this and live." It is that simple. As New Testament Christians we can pattern our lives after what has been written and receive the reward of eternal life. As we look at this exchange between Jesus and this lawyer we are going to also look at the lies the devil tells people about what is written and what he thought he could convince Jesus of by twisting God's word.
