A Note From Bryan... The Power of Words

Words are so powerful; they have the ability to tear down or build up. I read an example recently of how words tear down. It was sent to me by a friend. It is the story of a middle-aged man struggling with chronic depression. Psychiatrists prescribed antidepressants. Through counseling it was revealed that his father's mental abuse was the real root of the pain. His father had been a self-made head of a large corporation and would repeatedly tell the man that he knew when it was time for him to take over the company he'd ruin it.

Living with such a sting would be hard for even the strongest. Driven by a desire to prove his father wrong the man worked unreasonably long hours, put a strain on his marriage which later drove him to alcohol and finally to drugs. This man's whole life was devastated, all by the power of his father's abusive words.

Proverbs 28:21 says "Death and life are in the power of the tongue." Rather than cause one another turmoil and pain with our words we should choose words that build up and encourage. We are encouraged by the apostle Paul to "Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one", Colossians 4:6. Again in Ephesians 4:29, Paul wrote, "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers."
