A Note From Bryan... Lost Sheep

In the Bible one finds a number of passages that speak of sheep and their shepherds. At the time the Bible was being revealed to mankind shepherding was a common way of life and sheep were a common sight. The people who heard the message of Jesus could understand what Jesus was saying when He talked about sheep because they were familiar with the ways of sheep.

When Isaiah spoke his messianic prophecy in chapter 53 of his Old Testament book he said, "We all like sheep have gone astray..." verse six. Often the references to sheep and shepherds are referring to people and their leaders, particularly God's relationship with His people. It may interest you to know that God sees us as His sheep. It may hurt us a little, too, because we think of ourselves as smart, strong, and independent. Sheep are none of those things.

In Matthew 18:11-14, which we will study this morning, Jesus spoke of how God sent Him into this world to save the lost and He compared his mission on earth to that of a shepherd going after one lost sheep. We are going to look at the concept of what it means to be lost and how the sheep (people) become lost. Possibly the most powerful thought in this passage is the last one. People find it hard to accept that they are lost and may become offended at the suggestion of it. However, it is comforting to know that God doesn't want people to be lost, "Even so it is not the will of your Father who is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish."

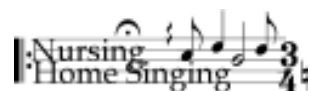
