A Note From Bryan... Lord Teach Us To Pray

If you have been a Christian for any length of time you would probably attest to the power of prayer. Most Christians typically have a story they like to tell of a time in their lives when prayer was answered or how effective it was to know others were praying for them. In Luke 11:1-13 Jesus' disciples came asking Jesus to teach them how to pray. There is the other side of the coin. There are those Christians who are conflicted internally about prayer; they are unsure their prayers are heard, they are unsure if their prayers are being done right. There are still other Christians who still don't know how to talk to God or simply choose not to talk to Him.

It is a significant fact that these disciples were so insistent on being taught to pray. First, for some prayer seems like a "no brainer" you just talk to God. That wasn't really what was on the minds of these folks. They wanted to have the prayer life Jesus had. For them the key to a successful walk with God was connecting with Him in prayer. When I look at this request what astounds me is that of all the marvelous things they witnessed like miracles of healing, and stilling the storm, and the power of His teaching and preaching they most wanted to emulate Jesus' prayer life.

As we explore this request today we are going to examine Jesus' reaction to the request. Sure, Jesus gave the model prayer which has important component parts we'll examine but Jesus went on with two parables that illustrate the importance of persistence in prayer and praying with a faithful heart and mind, knowing and believing that God will answer our prayers and fulfill our requests beyond our wildest imaginations and in ways we never conceived.
