A Note From Bryan. . . How do you measure greatness?

There are probably as many perspectives on greatness as there are people. We all have ideals in our minds about such things as success, love, greatness, and others, and my ideal may be a little different than yours. For many of us, rather than define greatness, we might explain that we know it when we see it. In that case, what are the examples you would hold up as greatness? Again, we would all hold up different examples of greatness.

The synoptic gospels all include a discussion between the disciples as to who was going to be the greatest in the kingdom of God. From these discussions we come away understanding something about what those early disciples thought about greatness. It would be great, they thought, to have a place in a king's court. This is what they believed about Jesus; that He was going to be a king with an earthly kingdom and that they were going to receive appointments as lords and governors.

Jesus did not allow these delusions of grandeur to go on. He quickly turned the discussion to the truth about His definition of greatness. They had everything turned around and confused. In reality, Jesus' reign was far more grand than any earthly king, yet what he looked for was faith and unconditional service. I can only imagine that the disciples had a difficult time processing this change of perspective. I'm sure what they wanted to say was, "but...?" We do well to take from this discussion some instruction for ourselves.

What we consider greatness, even in the spiritual realm, is not always what God considers greatness. Bigger is not always better. Expense does not insure quality. Popularity and effectiveness in human eyes is not evidence of God's blessing. Greatness in the eyes of God may very well be counter to our own intuition.
