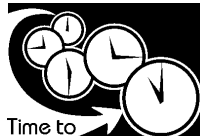
Register now for this month's program for children ages 3 years old to 5th graders. We will have pizza and be working on arts and crafts. Servants are needed to help with arts and crafts.

A Note From Bryan. . . Control Your Tongue

Control your tongue or it will control you. In James 1:19 the context had been established that Christians ought to listen more often than they speak and then, in chapter three, James was inspired by God to take on the subject of controlling the tongue. I have mentioned to you before in a sermon that I have had far more regrets of things I have said than regrets of things I didn't say. Once the words pass your lips they can't be taken back and it takes a very long time and many apologies to repair the damage caused by too many words.

The Johnson O'Connor battery of aptitude testing lists a good vocabulary as being a natural gift. After much research into the subject of natural gifts these experts have found that people are born with a propensity for language and vocabulary or they are not particularly gifted in that area. Language and vocabulary are just a few of the areas of natural gifts they list but the one that is most germane to this discussion of using the tongue. Sometimes those who have the gift of language and vocabulary are accused of talking too much. When a person talks too much it is bound to happen that the wrong words come out at the wrong time in front of the wrong people.

In the third chapter of James we have some great teaching cautioning us about controlling our speech. He uses powerful illustrations of how we tame animals and sail across oceans with comparatively small tools and our wits but humanity has not figured out how to tame the tongue. James points out the responsibility, influence, and inconsistency of the human tongue. On the one hand we might sing praises to God and with the same mouth curse our neighbor who was created in the image of God. He points out that this should not be the case with God's people. The overall point seems to be that if we are not able to control our tongues our tongues will control us.
