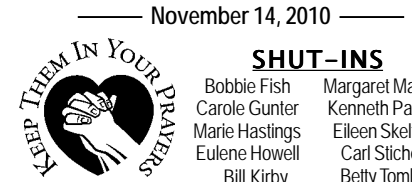

A Note From Bryan. . . Where Is the Mission Field?

Often times we answer this question by naming places we've supported and/or places that we have visited. It is really an exciting treat to get to visit a far-flung corner of the globe a get a look at mission works and foreign cultures. I have had the great pleasure of visiting South and Southeast Asia as well as Central America and the Caribbean. I always come back with a renewed sense of purpose and mission. While many Americans who do mission work for the first time are impressed by the poverty they see in the world when we really ought to be impressed by our brethren's faith.

There is a much simpler answer to the question above. The mission field begins at your front door. I know that this answer doesn't carry the same sense of cache and adventure but it is no less true. Your neighborhood is a mission field. In John 4:35 Jesus told His disciples to lift up their eyes and look at the harvest that was right in front of their eyes. I wish every American Christian had the opportunity to visit a foreign mission for at least one week of their life if it was only for a sense of perspective. However, this is where you were planted and this is where you are most effective. It is important to consider the fact that Jesus never ventured beyond the borders of the land of His birth as a missionary unless you consider His mission among the ten cities (Decapolis).

This morning I want to share a few practical thoughts about our common mission in our different neighborhoods. I want us to consider whether our neighborhoods are better off because we live there or if our presence there has made any difference at all. Fulfilling the Great Commission would not have us wringing our hands if we followed a simple formula like "each one reach one" or "each one teach one." No one has said that you are responsible for the entire neighborhood, just the ones who will allow you to reach and teach them.
