The year is almost over and a new year is about to begin. As you consider your life, what do you want to do differently this year in your walk with God? Hebrews 10:24-25, "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." One thing we all need to work on this year, besides getting closer to Christ, is to cultivate a better relationship with one another.

Hebrews 10:24, 25 speaks to us of an interdependent relationship. These words from the mouth of God speak to the need we have for each other. As the verses teach, let's all reflect upon what we can do to be an encouragement to one another.
